ABOUT THE SHOW

Yasuke, The Black Samurai is a theater experience incorporating Japanese folk theater, dance, songs, fight-choreography, taiko drumming, and film score music; all together in a dramatic story setting.

THE STORY

Yasuke - The Black Samurai is an awe-inspiring tale of true events that unfolds in the 16th Century of Feudal Japan. It recounts the journey of Yasuke, an African man uprooted from his native land of Mozambique, only to be brought to Japan, where he is bestowed with respect in a society known for its discipline and moral codes.

In Japan, he discovers the Samurai culture where the way of living life carries the utmost significance. Although cultural differences create myriad conflicts for Yasuke at first, the chasm starts slowly fading away as he recognizes his true potential in a world where men treat each other with honor.

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



BÁLINT VARGA (Music & Book) Originally from Budapest, Hungary, Balint is a NY-based writer, composer, and immigration advocate. He started playing piano at age 4. At 17, he moved to Paris where he started his first professional work at the Bastille Opera House. First, he graduated from Béla Bartók Conservatory, later he moved to America and studied composition and conducting at Berklee College of Music. His work has been performed at Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, Birdland, Symphony Hall, 54 Below. He received his US Green Card for extraordinary abilities based on his achievements in his field. Notable writing credits: *d'ILLUSION, Hypatia and the Heathens, Reflections, Gailley and the Tale of the Fate Keeper, Where We Rush To Disappear, Why Don't I Have A Girlfriend?* He's the recipient of the Charles Mayer Grant, a Jonathan Larson Award finalist, and a proud member of the Dramatists Guild and the Lehman Engel BMI Advanced Musical Theatre Workshop. PAUL LAURENCE DUNBAR (Poems)

(1872-1906) was a groundbreaking African-American poet, novelist, and playwright whose work left an indelible mark on American literature. Born in Dayton, Ohio, he was the son of formerly enslaved parents. Dunbar's poetry, characterized by its poignant themes and mastery of dialect, offered a unique glimpse into the African-American experience during the late 19th century. His notable works include "Lyrics of a Lowly Life" (1896) and "Oak and Ivy" (1893), which showcased his lyrical talents and social commentary. Dunbar's writing skillfully navigated both standard English and African-American Vernacular English, earning him recognition as one of the first African-American poets to reach a broad, racially diverse audience.

Despite a tragically short life, Paul Laurence Dunbar's literary contributions continue to inspire readers and scholars, highlighting the enduring power of his words in addressing issues of race, identity, and human dignity.

KIHO YUTAKA (VIOLIN) is a New York based Violinist/Composer originally from Yokohama, Japan. Kiho's violinist debut in NY was at the off-Broadway theater, The Gallery Players, in October of 2012. Since then, she has performed at notable venues such as PlayStation Theater, Beacon Theater, John F. Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, among other venues in the tri-state area with various artists. She also worked as a copyist under Bill Elliott, 24 Hour Musical, and on the upcoming production of CATS (PAC). Kiho was also the contractor/violinist at Fukushima Night in NY, held at One World Observatory on May 30, 2018. The Governor of Fukushima Prefecture, to dispel the bad reputation of Fukushima products since the devastation of 2011 Tōhoku Earthquake and Nuclear Power Plant disaster, hosted this event and invited local Fukushima industries to promote their safe and high quality products. Kiho strives to bring people and culture together for the music industry and beyond.



ZACHARY BROWN (CELLO) is a contemporary cellist based out of New York City, and born in Far Rockaway, Queens. With degrees in Cello Performance and a Concentration in Jazz studies from Ithaca College and Purchase Conservatory, Zach is a cellist that studies and performs both classical repertoire, as well as Jazz and contemporary art forms. Bridging the gap in musical genres, he focuses on his main project Westbound Situation, a string quartet that performs a fusion of Jazz, classical, and bluegrass into one, all original material. He has been cello and chamber music faculty at the Usdan Performing Arts Camp, The Larchmont Music Academy, and Riverfolk Music and Arts. He has performed as a guest soloist for both the Mansfield and Marquette symphony orchestras, as well as guest artist at The New Directions Cello Festival.



SUMIE KANEKO (SHAMISEN) is a Japanese koto and shamisen player and vocal artist. In 2002 after studying Japanese traditional music at Tokyo National University of the Arts, Sumie moved to Boston and studied Jazz vocal at Berklee College of Music. She has performed at such prestigious venues as Carnegie Hall, Lincoln Center, Blue Note NY, TED Talk, Google, Getty Center, Boston Ballet, and the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. She is renowned for her ability to collaborate with a diverse array of visionary international artists and writers: Pulitzer Winner Paula Vogel, composer Evan Ziporyn, taiko artist Kenny Endo and Kaoru Watanabe, and American Ballet Theater principal dancers Isabella Boylston and James Whiteside. Sumie tours overseas as a cultural exchange artist. She has performed in over 20 countries. Also as an educator, she has lectured at large academic scenes including Harvard University, Princeton University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Texas A&M University, and Aoyama Gakuin University as a renowned international artist.





She has also collaborated and worked with Shane Shanahan of the Silkroad Ensemble, Brooklyn Raga Massive, Chieko Kojima and Yuta Sumiyoshi of KODO, Alicia Hall Moran, Sonoko Kawahara (theatre director), Parijat Desai (dancer), Garrett Fisher (composer), Satoshi Takeishi, Kiyohiko Semba, Ying-Chieh Wang, and Woonjung Sim. Fumi currently teaches at Wesleyan University and serves as the primary instructor at Kaoru Watanabe Taiko Center, giving classes and educational workshops at local schools and colleges. She has also taught at the North American Taiko Conference, the East Coast Taiko Conference, and the European Taiko Conference. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Earth and Environmental Sciences from Wesleyan University and a Master of Music degree in piano performance from Manhattan School of Music.

DAVE D'ARANJO (BASS), a bassist and producer from Singapore, holds three degrees from Berklee College of Music and is an alumnus of The Bass Collective in NYC. He's a versatile musician who has traveled the world exploring various musical styles. In 2008, he was featured in an instructional DVD by five-time Grammy Award-winning bassist Victor Wooten. As the founder of Interrobang Records, he championed jazz and world music from recent Berklee graduates. Dave is also an ASCAP member and a voting Recording Academy member, with attendance at Grammy Awards in 2014, 2017, and 2018. Dave made his Broadway debut in "Hamilton" in 2022 and continues to sub on electric, upright, and synth bass at the Richard Rodgers Theatre. His Off-Broadway debut was in 2020, contributing to the original musical "The Perfect Fit." In 2017, he played bass in the 50th-anniversary celebration of "Hair: The American Tribal Love-Rock Musical." Dave also has an extensive background playing bass in various cabarets, performances, recordings, and regional theater productions.



ANTHONY DI BARTOLO (DRUMS / PERCUSSION) is a New Jersey-based percussionist, composer, and sound artist. ABOUT THE CHARACTERS

YASUKE (a.k.a. The Black Samurai): originally named SIWAZURI (fictional name), a robust African man who arrived from Mozambique in Japan on a ship of an Italian Jesuit missionary after his wife was killed. Later, he is offered to join the Japanese daimyō Oda Nobunaga's samurai army. Having lost faith in humanity, Nobunaga gives him a new purpose in life.

ODA NOBUNAGA: "The Great Unifier," a Japanese lord who launched a war against other daimyōs (lords) to unify Feudal Japan. Nobunaga's rule was noted for innovative military tactics, fostering free trade, and Japan's civil government reforms. He became Yasuke's mentor and friend.

AMATERASU: Japanese sun goddess, she is the Queen of Heaven, the kami, and creation itself. Amaterasu's primary role is that of the sun goddess. In this position, she not only serves as the literal rising sun that illuminates all things but also provides nourishment to all living creatures and marks the orderly movement of day into night.

KUENDELEA: (fictional character), Yasuke's wife from Mozambique, killed in a riot between two tribes before Yasuke left his home. Later, she materializes as a ghost and in the form of Yasuke's consciousness.

ALESSANDRO VALIGNANO: an Italian Jesuit missionary who spread the love of Jesus Christ and helped people seek God in all things. He brought Yasuke to Japan. Later, Valignano and Yasuke became close friends too.

AKECHI MITSUHIDE: a successful general under Nobunaga during his war of political unification in Japan. Later, Mitsuhide rebelled against Nobunaga in the Honnō-ji incident and forced the unprotected Nobunaga to commit seppuku (ritual suicide) in Kyoto.

AME-NO-UZUME: Japanese goddess of the dawn, known for her merriment and humor. Credited with inventing the performing arts, her spontaneous dancing once saved the world from eternal darkness. Traditional stories describe Ame-no-Uzume as wearing loose or revealing clothing, which other kami in these stories find comical, but Ame-no-Uzume is joyful and unconcerned. She's placed in the service of Amaterasu.

SUSANOO-NO-MIKOTO: Younger brother of Amaterasu. The Storm God who causes chaos and destruction. In this story, he materializes in the form of ray-of-light. *Voice only!*
